Welcome to the Arabic Language Centre (ALC)

Our Mission

To teach the Arabic language to current and future generations, using the unique Maliha Wehbe methodology, which aims to enable students to learn Arabic in a simplified and friendly manner, while appreciating its inherent logic and beautiful cultures.

ALC is committed to provide professional and quality educational services to its students, in an environment that values work ethics and promotes multiculturalism.

Our approach to teaching Arabic

The ALC has been teaching Arabic as a foreign language for over 30 years. The longevity of our success is due to key factors such as our unique method of teaching, structured classes and team of enthusiastic, passionate and well-trained teaching staff.

ALC is the only language school in Dubai to teach Arabic from beginners through to A-levels. We use a simplified and logical approach, exclusively developed by the founder, Maliha Wehbe, to make the learning experience, easy, effective and fun. The Arabic we teach is the spoken Arabic, a simplified form of Modern Standard Arabic, which can be understood throughout the Arab World. We do identify regional expressions and accents as we understand many of our students travel throughout the Gulf and beyond. In more advanced levels, we gradually introduce classical Arabic, which is necessary for those intending to pursue our Advanced Arabic Programme and/or sit for international examinations. While our courses teach the script so our students can read and write in Arabic, the emphasis is getting our students to speak the language and use it with confidence.

Courses Offered:

• Beginners I (32 hours)

• Beginners II – III (30 hours each) followed by Beginners Conversation (30 hours) to reinforce all of the vocabulary learned in the first three levels.

• Intermediate I – III (30 hours each) followed by Intermediate Conversation (30 hours) to consolidate all of the vocabulary & grammar learned thus far, but in new situations.

- Transition (30 hours) which prepares students for the advanced courses.
- Advanced Arabic Programme I (240 hours)
- Advanced Arabic Programme II (120/240 hours)

For students with an existing knowledge of Arabic, we can arrange a placement assessment to determine their current level of knowledge. The cost for this is AED100, which is deductible from the course fees. Certificates are issued after each level to students who have completed the course.

Types of Courses

Public Courses

Public Courses run six times a year. All of our courses are 30 hours in duration (unless specified otherwise) and classes are held for two hours, twice a week during the daytime and evening for maximum flexibility:

 Morning :
 9.00 am - 11.00 am

 Lunchtime :
 12.00 pm - 2.00 pm

 Afternoon :
 4.00 pm - 6.00 pm

 Evenings :
 6.30 pm - 8.30 pm

We limit the class size to a maximum of 12 students, and we require a minimum of 6 students to run a public course.

Private / Semi-Private Courses

For those unable to attend the scheduled public courses or wish to have a course structured to their requirements, we offer private tuition. Class timings are arranged to suit the needs of the individual, between 9.00 am and 6.00 pm and are usually held for 1½ or two hours, twice a week. However, more intensive schedules can be arranged if requested. Semi-private classes are conducted on the same basis with two to five people studying together.

Should you need to cancel a class, we request a minimum of 24 hours-notice, otherwise the full rate will still be charged.

All our public and private classes are held at our premises.

Corporate Courses

Many companies understand the importance of training several members of their staff in the Arabic language. For convenience, we offer corporate programmes that can be held on the company premises. Alternatively, if the company lacks sufficient training facilities, courses may be held on our premises. For this type of course, we would stipulate a maximum of 15 delegates per group.

Arabic for Children

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Cultural Arabic (14 hours)

The Course provides a good insight into cultural and social topics such as the values, traditions, social life, religions and geography of the Arab World. The course helps in creating cultural awareness and a better understanding of the Arabic norms and values. The course also includes an optional cultural trip.

Beginners I Intensive Part A (18 hours)

Topics covered: Common Greetings, Introductions, Giving Personal Data (Name, Occupation, Country of Origin, Profession), Family and Relations, Welcoming a Guest, Asking Questions using When, Where, What, How, How Much, How Many, Days of the Week, Prepositions, Numbers and Rules of Counting o – 10, Telephone Numbers

Grammar: Basic Word Structure, Basic Sentence Structure with or without action words, Verb Conjugation - Present Future Verb Tense (for the pronoun I), Descriptive Pattern, Interrogatives, Pronoun Pattern (I, We, You), Function Words (want and have), Dual and Plural forms of Nouns, Negations, Masculine-Feminine Nouns and Adjectives Agreement, Demonstrative Articles Extras: Listening Comprehension, Role Plays, Translations

Beginners I Intensive Part B - Continued From Part A (18 hours)

Topics covered: Arabic Script: Recognition of all letters, The rules of Arabic Writing, The Long Sounds (vowels) and Short Vowels (Harakaat), Symbols and stressed Syllable, The sun and moon letters

BEGINNERS CONVERSATION (30 hours)

Course description: A course revising all topics covered in the first three Beginners levels by using the same vocabulary and material in new situations. Emphasis is placed on oral communication skills, through role plays, guided and unguided conversations, translations and situations. Its aim is to present the same information in a new and different light to enable students to become more familiar with the vocabulary and to be able to communicate more fluently and with confidence.

INTERMEDIATE I (30 hours)

Topics covered: Business Trip • Travelling • Family • Traffic regulations • Car Accident • Personal Data • Education • Past Tense Pattern • Verb Forms continued

INTERMEDIATE II (30 hours)

INTERMEDIATE III (30 hours)

Topics covered: Immigration Department • Ministries • Weather & Climate • Means of Entertainment • At a Party • Past Continuous • Verb Forms • Nominal & Descriptive Patterns

INTERMEDIATE CONVERSATION (30 hours)

Course description: A course allowing students to strengthen their communication skills by revising the information they have covered in the previous Beginners and Intermediate levels through practical every day situations. This gives students the opportunity to further improve their knowledge of the topics covered through new situations. It aims to allow delegates to familiarise themselves with the many usages of the vocabulary they already know thus enabling them to converse fluently and with more confidence.

TRANSITION COURSE (30 hours)

A pre-requisite to joining the Advanced Arabic Programme, the course's objective is to allow students a smooth transition into the world of Classical Arabic. Course Description: Students are introduced to the classical form of words and grammatical concepts that have already been covered. The course aims to encourage students to develop an understanding of the written forms of the language and open the door to Arabic Media.

Advanced Arabic Programme I

(approx. 2 years) | 240 Hours

Course Description: The course addresses the four language skills at an advanced level. It aims to enable students to advance their knowledge of Classical Arabic and develop more sophisticated reading and writing skills, in addition to oral communication. Topics covered: Personal Information • Education • Social Situations • Sports Cultural Events • Politics • Tourism • Letter Writing • Nature and Service Industries (banks, hotels, restaurants, airlines, shopping). At the Arabic Language Centre, the programme incorporates Arabic Media (Radio, TV, and Newspapers).

Advanced Arabic Programme II

(one/two year programme) | 120/240 Hours

The objective of the course is to give students a solid grounding in language skills, culture and society of the Arab world, allowing students to further their Classical Arabic knowledge to develop a good understanding of the written forms of the language in a variety of registers.

Topics Covered: Day-to-day matters • Society • Working world • Environment and Citizenship • International Context • Arab History • Arab Media • Culture • Socio-Culture • Vocalization • Nominal and Verbal Sentences • Noun Cases • Verb Moods • Adjectives • Adverbs • Particles and Numbers.
